Dear Parents & Guardians,

I recently had the opportunity to visit several parents who had voiced issues on a Chat Group. Let me be clear, I have no problem with this, nor do I want to stop parents from voicing their concern. My sole purpose is the vision of the schools which talks about stakeholders uniting. There is a quote that says; "Teamwork begins by trust" and effective teamwork has a lot to do with communication. 1. Resumption of School for Form 3 Students

The Form 3 Students returned to School on Monday 26th October and they seem to have settled in well. We continue to emphasise the need for each and every one of us to observe the Covid-19 Protocols.

2. Return of Form 1 & 2 Students

The Form 1 & 2 Students are expected to resume lessons at school on the 9th of November. Boarders will be expected to have signed into Hostel on Sunday 8th November by 4.00pm.

Please note that the Accounts Office will be open on Sunday 8th to attend to Parents and Students who will want to make School Fees payments. They will be open between 9.00am and 4.00pm so do make sure that you arrive well before 4.00pm to ensure you get a Fees Pass for your child to be able to get into Hostel. I would like to implore Parents to make sure that they are not late as late comers will not be entertained and Students will not be allowed into Hostel without a School Fees Pass.

Day Scholars will also be required to obtain a School Fees Pass to be able to have access into the classroom for lessons. Day Scholar Parents should also take advantage of the opportunity to make payment on Sunday 8th at the College Office.

3. External Exams

The Form 4, Lower 6 and Upper 6 Students are still writing their Cambridge Exams and the process this far has been smooth with no major issues. We hope to continue with the quiet set up which allows for our students to concentrate and write their exams in a peaceful environment.

Students should return Textbooks as soon as they have finished writing their last exam for each subject. A Clearance Certificate should be signed by each subject teacher upon the return of each subject's textbook(s).

4. 6th Form Leavers' Event

We held our 6th Form Leavers' event last week on Saturday 24th October at the Prep School Pool. We had to compromise and have a braai instead of the usual lavish and elegant evening we normally hold for the leavers because of the Covid-19 pandemic.

It was different but the children seemed to enjoy the more relaxed environment while they swam, listened to some music and enjoyed their meal.

5. Online Speech Day

The Covid-19 pandemic has taken most of us out of our comfort zones and most certainly out of our normal routines. This year has seen us, if not most schools, not holding the usual Speech & Prize Giving event where all stakeholders gather to celebrate the achievements made by our students.

We are currently putting together a pre-recorded Speech & Prize-Giving Event that we intend to air on several social media platforms. You will be advised towards the end of next week the date on which we will air the event as well as on which media platforms you will be able to access the event.

6. Students' Dress Code

May I take this opportunity to remind parents and students of the expected dress code to school on a daily basis; Students are expected to come to School in their School Uniform everyday – smartly dressed and well groomed. This includes the Exam Candidates (Form 4, Lower 6 & Upper 6 Students). Tracksuits are not permitted in the mornings and can only be worn in the afternoons at 1.00pm onwards.

Boys are expected to be clean shaven at all times.

I implore parents to check that children adhere to the school rules. With effect from Monday 2nd November, Staff will be on the lookout for students who have not taken heed of our reminder and anyone found breaking the rules will be put on manual.
